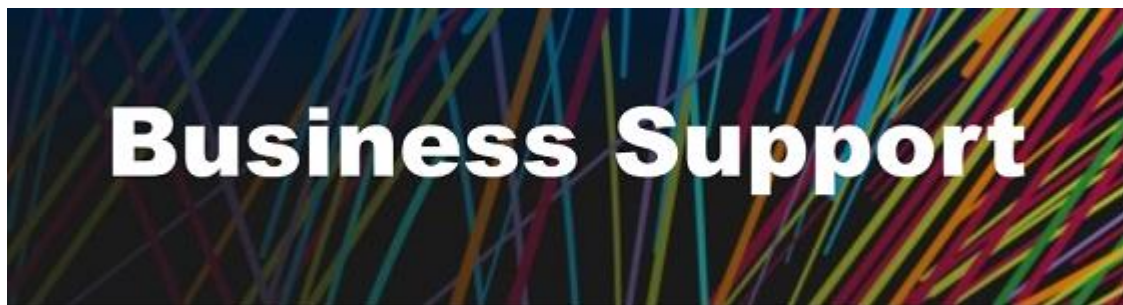


StartEast February bulletin

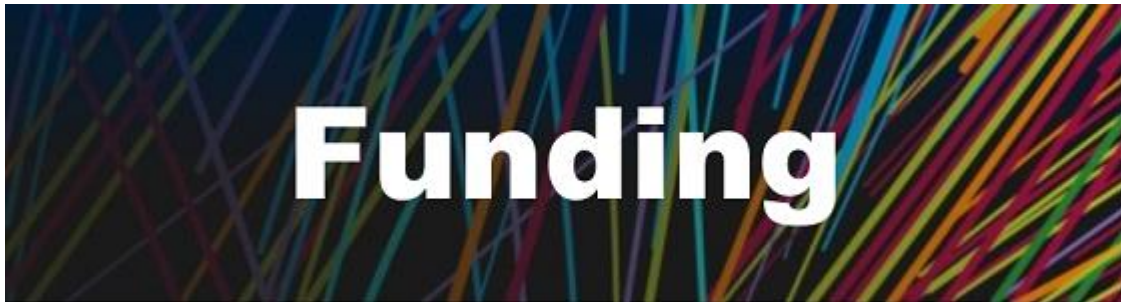
Creative Enterprise
