Celebrating Culture 2021

An exciting new seasonal PR and marketing campaign will launch in late May to celebrate our rich and diverse arts, culture and heritage sectors across Norfolk and Suffolk. Led by the New Anglia Culture Board (NACB) and supported by the New Anglia LEP, Norfolk County Council, Suffolk County Council, Interreg EXPERIENCE project, University of East

Anglia and Visit East of England, 'Celebrating Culture 2021' aims to put the region on the map as a 'must see' UK cultural destination.

The first campaign phase will promote what's happening in and around Norfolk and Suffolk across summer months, engaging primarily with local media, communities and visiting tourists, to help bring people back to events and venues safely. This will be followed by an outreach cultural tourism campaign to attract new audiences and promote autumn and winter experiences including overnight stays to those living further afield (2-3 hour travel time), such as London, Essex and the East Midlands.

Norfolk Open Studios is open to all Norfolk artists and makers, whether professional, starting out, discovering or rediscovering their creativity. It's an opportunity for artists to promote and sell their work from their own studios, meet art lovers, demonstrate their skills and talent and get to know other local artists. In 2021 the scheme will take place from 25 September - 10 October. **The deadline to apply to take part is 23 April.**
