Creative Unlimited Business & Entrepreneurs Support Programme

The Creative Unlimited project is designed to help economic recovery and growth in the creative, cultural and digital sectors in Norfolk and Suffolk and is a partnership between New Anglia LEP, University of East Anglia, Norwich University of the Arts, University of Suffolk, Suffolk County Council and Norfolk County Council (as part of the legacy of the StartEast programme). The project will help organisations and individuals develop and showcase their creative ventures through bespoke business workshops, masterclasses, mentoring and direct support. Lowestoft Virtual Creative Hub

Funded by Arts Council England, the Virtual Creative Hub will provide creatives in Lowestoft with a way to network, feel more connected and access information, training and funding opportunities, bringing creatives together through social media channels and an emerging place website, which will be launched later this summer.

ESF LIFT/Community Grants

Employer Training Incentive Programme (ETIP) is a delegated training grant programme, aiming to assist Norfolk SMEs (less than 250 employees) in sectors that have been most effected or highlighted by COVID-19. Ragdoll Foundation Grants

The Ragdoll Foundation's Open Grants Scheme supports the cultural sector's work with children and young people to provide high quality, innovative arts engagement projects where the concerns of childhood can be heard. All applications are expected to contribute to the Ragdoll Foundation's primary purpose. There are two strands:

Small Grants: For innovative, arts-based small projects, pilots, or research & development to inform a new project or programme of work. Applications for up to £1,500 can be made and there are five deadlines per year.

Main Grants: For larger or longer-term new projects, or proposals that significantly develop the scope or scale of an existing programme, project or pilot in the region of £5k to £20k. [Find out more and apply](#)

Government Self-Employment Income Support Scheme (SEISS)

Applications for the fifth SEISS Grant open in late July covering the period from 1 May 2021 to 30 Sept 2021. Anyone who was eligible for the first set of grants will be eligible (provided their business is still impacted) and those who were newly self-employed in 2020 and therefore did not have tax returns may also now qualify for SEISS. 
