A new report by Julie's Bicycle, [Culture: The Missing Link to Climate Action](#), says that the global creative community has embraced environmental action at local, sectoral and national level, which has grown substantially during the pandemic, and there is an opportunity now for government policy to draw on the culture sector's creativity and power to motivate.
