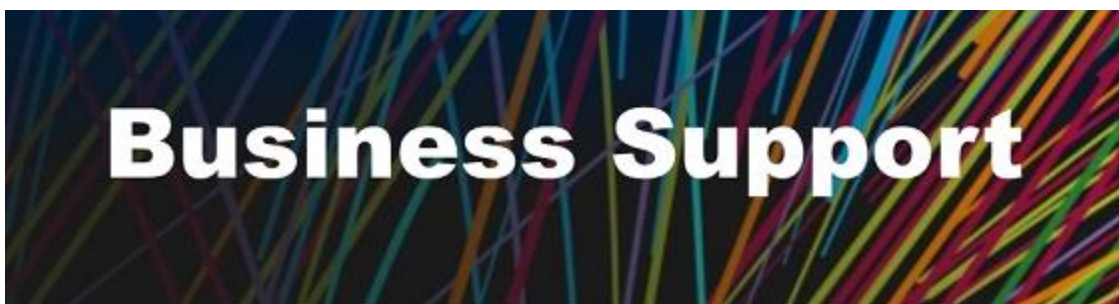
Welcome to the August edition of our bulletin.

NCW Emerging Translator Mentorships 2023

The National Centre for Writing is seeking applications from translators into English for the [2022/23 NCW Emerging Translator Mentorship programme](#).

The scheme matches up experienced translators with emerging translators for a six-month period during which they work together on practical translation projects, developing their craft through working on a chosen text or texts and acting as an adviser to the mentee on aspects of life as a professional translator.

Girton College: Cavendish Arts Science Fellowship

We are seeking adventurous artists who challenge traditional ways of knowing, engage with communities, and enjoy collectively imagining new possibilities. 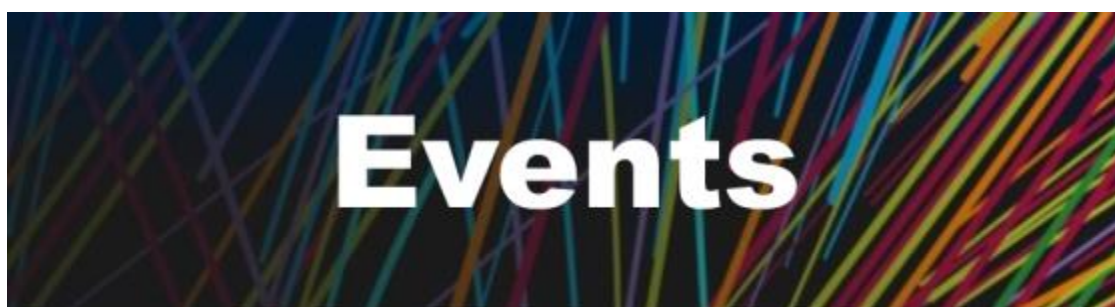

Funding

Grants available for Broadland-based businesses

[Broadland District Council](#) is offering two grant schemes for businesses in the area.

[The start-up grant scheme](#) aims to encourage and support new business start-ups in Broadland by providing grant funding of £1,000 towards the start-up costs supporting the growth of the business.

[The enterprise grant scheme](#) for existing small businesses in Broadland, aims to assist with their expansion and development. The grant is match funded and can be used to fund half the costs of a wide range of business activities up to a maximum grant payment of £750.

Babergh and Mid Suffolk Community Development Grants

The newly launched Community Development Grant seeks to support local communities and organisations in both Babergh and Mid Suffolk. [Community Development Grants](#) can be revenue or capital up to 100% of total project costs (up to a maximum grant of £20,000). **Deadline: 16 September 2022**

Powering Up – Power to Change

[Powering Up](#) supports community businesses in the key areas of digital growth, environmental sustainability, and financial resilience, with a cross cutting theme of diversity, equity and inclusion. Supporting community businesses with a tailored support package for each business worth up to £20,000 in total.

Deadline: 19 September 2022

Grant schemes for electric vehicle charging infrastructure

The government offers grants to support the wider use of electric and hybrid vehicles via the Office of Low Emission Vehicles (OLEV). This includes [The Workplace Charging Scheme](#) (WCS) a voucher-based scheme that provides support towards the up-front costs of the purchase and installation of electric vehicle charge-points, for eligible businesses, charities and public sector organisations.

New Founder Incubator Grants Programme

The [New Founder Programme](#) is designed to help budding entrepreneurs from underrepresented backgrounds start and grow their businesses into sustainable

enterprises that have a positive, long-lasting impact on their communities. Graduates of the New Founder Incubator programme can apply for a grant of up to £5,000 to help them grow their businesses.

Deadline: 5 September 2022

Playable City Sandbox, Watershed

[Funding](#) is available for creative enterprises, artists, designers, architects and creative practitioners in the UK to develop prototypes of technological concepts that encourage happier, more cohesive urban living. Six teams will each be awarded funding of up to £45,000. **Deadline for Expressions of Interest 12 August 2022**

Norfolk Social Infrastructure Fund

The [Social Infrastructure Fund](#) is Norfolk County Council's capital grants scheme for voluntary and non-profit making groups who are involved in community projects and initiatives that benefit the residents of Norfolk. The grant is for capital projects that support the Council's Better Together, for Norfolk strategy, and that help the county with the challenges it currently faces, such as increased living costs. £225,000 is available for smaller projects of between £5,000 and £50,000, and £550,000 for larger projects between £50,000 and £250,000.

Deadline for Expressions of Interest: 5pm on 19 September 2022

BFI Doc Society - Features Fund

Doc Society is administering the UK's national documentary film fund for features and shorts. [The Fund](#) aims to champion a breadth of bold and distinctive filmmaking across the UK. Funding can only be a contribution towards the costs of a film. Production budgets cannot be more than £5,000.

Deadline: 16 September 2022

Art Fund Re-imagine Fund

The [Reimagine programme](#) is designed to inspire creativity and increase stability in the sector. It supports organisations to develop or refresh their work in response to the challenges posed by the pandemic. Grants of up to £50,000 are available to fund projects that will help organisations reimagine their approach to engagement.

Deadline: 12 September 2022

PRS Oram Awards

[Development bursaries](#) of up to £1,500 available to recognise emerging female and gender minority artists in the fields of music, sound and related technologies.

Deadline of 15 August 2022

PRS Foundation Beyond Borders

[Beyond Borders](#) stimulates and strengthens cross-border collaborations between music creators, performers and presenters. Funding of up to £15,000 is available for the creation, touring and promotion of innovative and high-quality new music across all genres and encourages engagement with audiences across England, Scotland, Wales, Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland through multiple performances and digital activity.

Deadline 19 September 2022

Scops Arts Trust

The goal of [Scops Arts Trust](#) is to help people to understand, participate in and enjoy the arts, particularly the performing arts. We are keen to find projects which widen access and have a lasting cultural impact on the community. We are especially interested in supporting performing arts projects aimed at adults and projects which will benefit all ages across the generations, not only children. The scheme will re-open for applications on 16 August 2022.

Norfolk and Suffolk County Councils Pathways Training Fund

Part funded by the European Social Fund (ESF), training is being offered by a network of local providers to individuals employed by Norfolk and Suffolk SME businesses in these 'must have' areas: Digital Skills and Industry 4.0, Leadership, Management, Project Management and Mentoring, Customer Service and Client Relationship Management, Health and Well-being and Innovation training for new ideas, ways of working, products and services, Net Zero.
