Creative East: Create Growth Programme

<u>The Creative East: Create Growth Programme</u> is a £1.275 million investment readiness and business support programme, funded by the Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport, to boost growth in the creative industries across the East.

The 12-week package offers participants a bespoke programme of specialist seminars, round table events, one-to-one expert mentoring, pitching sessions and networking events, covering everything you ever needed to know to get your business in shape to

take on investment and grow. Participants will be offered exclusive access to key experts in their field from the world of investment and creative industries.



New High Growth Network Programme to Help Your Business Grow

The High Growth Network (HGN) programme is a brand new, fully funded New Anglia Growth Hub scheme designed to help small businesses in Norfolk and Suffolk learn critical business skills and create strong networks with like-minded peers. Upon completion, businesses will have produced their own actionable business plan to support their high growth over the coming 12 months. Any industry is welcome. New Start-up Grant for Norfolk Businesses

The <u>Business & IP Centre Norfolk</u> in conjunction with <u>MENTA Business</u>, have launched a new Business Start-Up Grant to help aspiring Norfolk business owners get their businesses up and running successfully.

Start-up and recently established small and micro businesses (trading for less than 24 months and under £250,000 projected first year turnover), based in Norfolk, may apply for grants of between £300 and £1,500 to assist with the purchase of equipment, stock, marketing or professional services that will kick-start establishing the business. Grants may be used to fund projects or activities costing in the range of £400 to £2,500, with a self-invested applicant contribution required of 25% (for projects of £400-£500), 30% (for projects of £501-£1,000) or 40% (for projects of £1,001-£2,500).

Creative Enterprise Screen Sector Business Support Programmes

<u>Creative Enterprise Foundations</u> is an intense business development programme specifically designed to address very-early stage screen businesses including film & TV, games, animation, immersive, creative tech. **Deadline 4 December 2023.**

<u>Creative Enterprise Scaling Up</u> is a brand new 5-month business development programme, to support companies working in the screen sector who are looking to develop and grow their business. **Deadline 4 December 2023.**

<u>Creative Enterprise: Investment Readiness Programme</u> is designed to equip screen companies with the necessary tools and knowledge for securing various forms of investment, ranging from equity to debt and grants. **Applications open on 3 January 2024.**

Help to Grow: Management Course with Norwich Business School

Help to Grow: Management is a 12-week applied course supporting managers and leaders of small and medium sized businesses. Delivered by Norwich Business School, the programme is accredited by the <u>Small Business Charter</u>, with funding support from HM Government. 



Innovate UK Creative Catalyst: Al in the Music Industry Competition

UK registered businesses can apply for grants to fund projects that develop new innovative products and services for the UK music industry. Up to £1 million has been allocated to fund industrial research projects. Each project's total costs must be between £100,000 and £250,000. Read more.

Innovate UK Creative Catalyst Challenge Fund

Grants of up to £250,000 are available for businesses in the creative industries to fund the research and development of an innovative new product, system or process that decarbonises or reduces waste within the creative industries. Read more.
